G20: SHAPING THE GLOBAL LANDSCAPE IN THE 21ST CENTURY



The main agenda of the G20 2023 summit is Restructuring global debt arrangements, supervising and regulating digital currencies, raising financial assistance for emerging economies, focusing on policies to promote gender equality, and managing the influence of geopolitical uncertainties on food stability.

African Union G20 Membership

At the G20 summit held in New Delhi, the African Union was granted membership in the G20.

African Union G20 membership will make Africa more visible and influential on the world stage, giving us a better chance to work together for the good of our people.

India-Middle East-Europe Corridor

At the G20 summit in New Delhi, India, the US, and other countries including France, Germany, Italy, Saudi Arabia, and UAE signed a memorandum of understanding for the establishment of the India- Middle East-Europe corridor. This initiative holds immense potential for boosting trade and connectivity between India, the Middle East, and Europe, thereby fostering economic integration and diplomatic ties across regions.

G20 New Delhi Leaders Declaration

This declaration includes a wide range of global concerns and a strong commitment to address them. The summit also launched an organisation named, Global Biofuel Alliance, for promoting the adoption and implementation of sustainable Biofuels. It also aims to set up standards and certification procedures, for the creation of a more sustainable global energy environment.
